Year-by-Year Program Overview

9th grade students participate in a course schedule that allows them to complete their required credit-granting courses within the Michigan Merit Curriculum. Some of these courses include American Literature, US History, Biology, Physical Education, and Algebra or Geometry. In addition to their required course schedule, they also engage in elective courses when schedules allow.

10th Grade Students participate in a course schedule that includes their required credit granting courses within the Michigan Merit Curriculum. Some of these courses include World Literature, World History, Health, Geometry or Algebra II. Students determine their academic pathway during this school year.

11th Grade Students engage in their predetermined pathway courses as well as their required courses for graduation. Students may participate in Early Middle College through the Freshwater Studies Pathway or have the opportunity to attend the Career Tech Program for half of the school day if they have chosen Agri-Science, Engineering and Architecture, or Community Leadership.

12th Grade Students continue their chosen pathway and complete any required courses needed for graduation. Depending on the selected pathway, students may spend their entire day at Greenspire High School, or they may split their days between NMC, Career Tech, and GHS. Students are encouraged to explore a program that merges with their interests and potential college or career opportunities. Students in the Freshwater Studies Early Middle College program will participate in a 13th year of the program, but will participate in the graduation ceremony at the end of their 12th grade year.
