VIII. Reports

a. Superintendent's Report – Walker reported on the high school and middle school enrollment for next year. The transition to Partner Solutions is going well and they have gone above and beyond to make this transition successful. Hiring is going

well with many positions being filled at the high school level and a couple of positions are being posted for the middle school. There are currently 62 sign-ups for the summer program. The first district wide event will take place on June 2nd at Thirlby Field. This Wednesday, the high school will host a mental health night presenting on a variety of mental health topics. Implementation II is underway. CTC and NMC are of high interest for our students. June 9, the TC Track Club is partnering for a trail run. Windows for Maple are in Traverse City and are waiting for an install date. There have been no more plumbing issues in Maple and the weather station will be connected in the coming weeks. A large thank you to the volunteers that helped with the pancake lunch. Students raised enough money for a sap boiler for next year.

- b. President's Report Babin-Ringsmuth submitted a report to the board folder as well as thanked the teachers for all of the work they have been doing as well as congratulating the Robotics team on their success.
- c. Treasurer's Report Batdorff reported a positive fund balance to end the year once the security grant is released. Walker and Batdorff are working on finalizing next year's budget. Batdorff stated the board needs to look at the sustainability of maintaining two campuses as we move forward.
 - i. CSP Grant Batdorff stated she is working on reporting and the next step is ordering technology. Implementation III funds will need to be spent in about three months.
- d. Authorizer's Report GVSU's representative, Matt Missias, congratulated the Robotics Team and reminded the board that the budget hearing notice must be published in a newspaper. Principal's meetings will be happening this week via live stream and the Social Studies Series, in partnership with the National Constitution Center will be offering opportunities for Social Studies teachers. State funding is still in the works but the foundation allowance should be an increase this year.
